What is Laura's Law—Assisted Outpatient Treatment (AOT)?

A Court may order a person to obtain Assisted Outpatient Treatment (AOT) if the Court finds that a person meets ALL of the following nine criteria:

- Be at least 18 years of age
- Suffer from a mental illness
- Unlikely to survive safely in the community without supervision
- Have a history of treatment non-compliance for one of the following: two occurrences of hospitalization or incarceration with the last 36 months; or one occurrence of serious or violent behavior within the last 48 months
- Refused or did not engage in prior opportunities for treatment
- Have a condition that is deteriorating
- AOT must be the least restrictive placement to ensure recovery and stability
- The treatment must be deemed to prevent a relapse or deterioration that would likely result in involuntary treatment through 5150
- Likely to benefit from AOT

This information can be found in the Welfare and Institutions Code, Sections 5345-5349.5

What are my rights if I am facing a Laura's Law/AOT Petition?

If you are the subject of an AOT petition, you have all of the following rights:

- To adequate notice of the hearings
- To receive a copy of the Court-ordered evaluation
- To obtain counsel of your choice, or utilize a Public Defender
- To be informed of your right to judicial review by habeas corpus
- To be present at the hearing unless you waive that right
- To present evidence
- To call witnesses on your behalf
- To cross examine witnesses
- To appeal decisions and be informed of your right to appeal

What services are provided under Assisted Outpatient Treatment (AOT)?

Laura's Law and AOT will provide recovery-oriented, evidence-based Assertive Community Treatment to adults with serious mental illness. Members may have a secondary co-existing drug and alcohol diagnosis. Services include:

- Mental health services
- Assessment and client planning
- Educational and vocational services
- Co-occurring disorder treatment
- Therapeutic groups
- Crisis intervention
- Medication support
- Case management

You cannot be forced to take medication against your will.
